

MODEL RAIL LINE STARTED

Tiny Gold Spike Put in Place in Hoboken Ceremony

HOBOKEN, N. J., Jan. 28 — William White, president of the Delaware, Lackawanna & Western Railroad System, drove a tiny gold spike into place in the quarter-inch scale model railroad system of the New York Society of Model Engineers, Inc., here tonight, to open the first loop of track of the model system the society is building as a hobby. Two hundred model railroad enthusiasts were present.

The miniature railroad is called the Union Connecting Railroad. Three hundred feet of track have been completed, rated the equivalent of three miles of real railroad track. Many more feet are to be added in the next seven years. The little railroad is housed in a large hall on the Upper Ferry Concourse of the Lackawanna Terminal here.
