Tales of Railroading, Making of Model Trains by Builders

Visitors to the Children's Room at the New York Public Library, Fifth Avenue and Forty-second Street, last night who came to see the current exhibition, "Transportation—by Land, Sea and Air," found a special feature prepared for them—tales of railroading and the making of model trains and engines by the builders of the models on display.

The library's guests, whose small-scale trains, ships and planes have attracted considerable attention from children and adult enthusiasts during the last few weeks, included members of the New York Society of Model Engineers and railroad men from the Lackawanna, the Baltimore & Ohio and the New York Central railroads.

Beside models of modern trains and one of the latest Army jet planes, the exhibition includes examples of the various means of transportation in use since the time of the ox-drawn cart. The display will continue through June.
