

# BOAT MODELS ON DISPLAY.

## Tiny Ocean Liners at Exhibition Travel 24 Miles an Hour.

Diminutive ocean liners, airplanes, motor boats, engines, cars, signals, stations, bridges, guns and locomotives will be on display all this week, beginning tomorrow, in the Knickerbocker Building at the model exhibition of the New York Society of Model Engineers. The models, made by members of the society, are nearly all the work of amateurs, who constructed them as hobbies. They operate like the full-sized articles they represent.

One of the models is a locomotive made for Vincent Astor, which is used on his estate to haul eight or ten persons at a time on a small railroad. It generates its own steam from coal and has all the mechanical devices of the modern giant of the rails.

The boat models will include ocean liners not more than two feet long, which generate their own power and have run twenty-four miles an hour, as well as gasoline motor boats, about forty inches long, which travel under their own power.
